Chaplain's Message

At the recent State Council Spring Meeting the day began with a Holy Hour. As the day went on several participants told me how much they enjoyed that time of prayer and reflection before the Eucharist. Someone remarked, "it set the spirit for the day." How true, for it reminds that our faith in Jesus is paramount to who we are and what we



strive to do as Knights and Ladies. I can also say I always enjoy celebrating or participating in a K of C Mass, whether at the council, state or supreme level. The participation is generally very real and very active. Again, it reminds that gathered for the Eucharist we are drawn together as a community, and we communally praise our God and share our faith. As we realize fewer people today participate in the weekly Eucharist as compared to past times, we also hear more people experience isolation and depression. It's not just the being together—we could do that at a ball game or a fish fry—but being together and with our Lord. The presence of Jesus, and the nourishment Jesus offers to us, is the difference.

During the Easter Season the first reading at Sunday Mass is generally from the Acts of the Apostles. The first 12 chapters of Acts tell the story of the early Church. Time and again we hear of how the people gather, pray together, share a meal (the Eucharist) as Jesus had told them to do ("do this in memory of me"), and support one another in their needs. It was seeing this behavior that drew many people to become disciples of Jesus (Acts 2:42-47).

Sometimes we hear people say "I get nothing out of going to Mass." Of course, we only grow in appreciation of the Mass by participating. If one doesn't watch or play a sport, the fine points of the game will never be understood. If one rarely listens to music, it is likely the listener will not appreciate the fullness of what they hear. So it is with going to Mass. At Mass we need to be not only present, but also actively participating, attentively listening, and joining in the communal worship. As we continue through the Easter Season, may we continue to meet the Lamb of God, the Risen Lord, in each Eucharist we attend.

Not a member? Come to a meeting as our guest and see what we are all about. You can contact any of the officers listed above for more information about our programs and meeting dates.


